About WHSC

White House Youth Soccer (WHYS) offers both recreational and competitive soccer programs, which are intended to provide a variety of levels for youth soccer players. Recreational soccer is intended to serve as an introductory level and consists of a single level of play. White House Soccer Club (WHSC) falls under the guidance of WHYS and manages the Competitive program which offers multiple levels or "divisions" intended to provide a progressive ladder for players as they develop their skills.

The WHSC Competitive Program is intended to offer a higher level of play for players with more advanced soccer skills. Competitive level teams play against other clubs, which requires travel within the Middle Tennessee area (as teams progress in skill, travel outside the Middle Tennessee area may be an option). Competitive level soccer requires a greater commitment

level from both players and parents. Once a player is added to a team, they are expected to attend team events (including practices, special training sessions, games and tournaments) on a regular basis.





Some WHSC Teams are coached by parents, but professional trainers are typically used to develop advanced soccer skills. These trainers can also serve as head coach for many competitive level teams. Professional trainers (or professional coaches) are typically paid for their services, which requires a greater financial commitment from parents as well. Each team typically plays between 18 to 20 games a season and practices twice weekly. Special positional and foot skills training sessions are offered to WHSC players at no extra cost.

Player fees have been averaging \$200—\$300 per season. The estimate is contingent on the number of tournaments a team wishes to play. Most teams average 3 to 4 tournaments per year and more tournaments means a higher cost. A cost will be determined each season based on tournaments, training fees, etc... Uniform costs are additional for the first year. Newly created teams under U12 are provided financial support by the WHSC to ease the transition between the recreational fee structure and limited fundraising opportunities are available as well. We have found that the professional training, extra game experience, special skills sessions, competing at a higher level and the opportunity to represent your community in tournament play is well worth the small incremental cost per session over recreational play.

Although most all of our players find success in High School environments several former WHSC players have advanced beyond high school to play at the college level. As a testament to our vision many former players are still involved in the game as referees, trainers and coaches. The ultimate goal of the club is to provide a very solid base for boys and girls to flourish as well as create a fun and safe environment for families to participate. Our success as a club isn't always measured in wins or loses but over the last few years, the club has managed to win two State Championships along with two runners up honors.
